Adj Prof John Mendoza



John is a Director of ConNetica, a social enterprise recognised for thought leadership in mental health and suicide prevention, comprehensive approach to service mapping, collaboration and integration, stakeholder engagement, suicide prevention training programs, advocacy and research. He has been involved in the development of ten integrated atlases across eight PHN regions in Australia in the past four years. John has authored and co-authored dozens of reports and submissions to public inquiries on mental health and suicide, and has held several executive positions including inaugural Chair of the Australian Government's National Advisory Council on Mental Health, CEO of the Mental Health Council of Australia and CEO of a Commonwealth Statutory Authority, the Australian Sports Drug Agency.

Dr Stephen Dann is a Certified Lego® Serious Play™ facilitator who has facilitated over 150 Lego Serious Play group workshops in Australia, Canada and the United Kingdom. He is a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (UK), and recipient of the Australian and New Zealand Marketing Academy Conference Emerging Educator award, the College of Business and Economics Education Innovation award, and the Australian National University Vice Chancellor's Citation for Outstanding Contribution to Student Learning for his development of innovative digital learning design.

Dr Tanya Bell BAppSc (Biol)(Hons) GCEd (HE) PhD (PHE), is a Population Health Epidemiologist with a passion for improving community health and well-being by translating evidence based primary health care into practice. Over the last 20 years, she has held a number of key research, academic and primary health care positions in Population Health, Epidemiology, Strategic Planning and Business Development. Tanya has expertise in health planning, as well as extensive experience in coordinating and managing large scale population studies and has been the recipient of national research and evaluation awards. More recently Tanya has taken a lead role assisting organisations to define and establish direction and priorities consistent with vision, values and strategy.

MaryAnne is undertaking a PhD at the CMHR based on the use of the DESDE-LTC in Australia. She has worked on and co-ordinated several Integrated Atlases of Mental Health, including those of the ACT, Central and Eastern Sydney, North Sydney, Perth North and Western Sydney regions. She has a background in nursing, including mental health nursing.

Dr Nasser Bagheri



Dr Nasser Bagheri is a Senior Research Fellow at the Australian National University (ANU) and recipient of an Australian Research Council DECRA Fellowship. He leads a spatial epidemiology team and co-leads the Visualisation and Decision Analytics (VIDEA) lab in the ANU Centre for Mental Health Research. His research has focused on chronic disease risk assessment, particularly cardiovascular disease (CVD), diabetes, mental health and dementia. He has a particular interest in spatial variation and quantifying the impact of modifiable risk factors including lifestyle and built environment, on chronic disease.

Dr Daniel Rock



Danny is an epidemiologist, a Fellow of the Royal Society for Public Health and an Adjunct Professor at the School of Psychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences, University of Western Australia. Prior to his current appointment, he held several senior health service executive and clinical research positions, most recently as Deputy Executive Director, North Metropolitan Health Service Mental Health and as director of the same organisation's Clinical Research Centre. He was clinical professor in the School of Psychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences and the School of Population Health, University of Western Australia and co-director of the same university's Centre for Clinical Research in Neuropsychiatry based at Graylands Hospital.

Prof Luis Salvador-Carulla



Professor Luis Salvador-Carulla is Head of the Centre for Mental Health Research at the Research School of Population Health, Australian National University. He has been an advisor to the Government of Catalonia (Spain), the Spanish Ministry of Health, the European Commission (EC) and the World Health Organisation (WHO). His research has focused on developing decision support systems in health and social policy, including tools for analysis of technical efficiency and benchmarking, indicators for health policy analysis and priority setting in mental health and in disability. He has coordinated the Integrated Atlas of Mental Health Project for mapping mental health services in over 30 local areas around the World. In 2012 he received the Harvard Medical School Leon Eisenberg Award for his contribution in the field of developmental disorders.

Dr Sebastian Rosenberg



Sebastian Rosenberg is the head of the Learning and Development Unit at the Centre for Mental Health Research at the ANU, and also Senior Lecturer at the Brain and Mind Centre at Sydney University. He completed his PhD in 2016, focusing on the issue of mental health and accountability – trying to tell whether what we are doing is really helping people. Sebastian also works as a consultant with several primary health networks and is on the board of Woden Community Service. His research into different aspects of accountability in mental health continues, through projects with government and other organisations. Sebastian has recently been appointed International Advisor to Universidad Loyola Andalucia on the Refinement-Spain Project in relation to mental health financing systems.
